

CABLE CHESS MATCH TO BE STAGED TODAY

Marshall to Play for New York in Test Against London for Insull Trophy.

In an effort to recover the Insull international chess trophy, wrested from Chicago in the cable match with London last year, a team of six New York experts will begin their challenge match with the team representing the London Chess League at 10 o'clock this morning. This end of the contest will be staged at the rooms of the Manhattan Chess Club, where five members of the New York team will be stationed. Frank J. Marshall, the United States champion, is still in England and will meet his opponent, F. D. Yates, the British champion, in London.

Moves in the remaining game will be exchanged by direct Western Union cable until 7 o'clock, New York time. The messages will be in the Kuhns chess code, accredited to M. S. Kuhns of Chicago, President of the National Chess Federation, who is here to act as British umpire of the match. The personnel of the two opposing teams will be as follows:

New York—F. J. Marshall, A. Kupchik, E. Lasker, I. Kashdan, M. A. Schapiro and A. E. Santasiere. Substitutes—E. Berman, A. S. Pinkus, I. Horowitz and E. Tholfsen.

London—F. D. Yates, W. Winter, V. Buerger, E. G. Sergeant, R. P. Michell and M. E. Goldstein. Substitute—E. T. Jesty.

According to word received from Marshall here yesterday, there will be another international tournament in Hastings during December, in which he may take part.
